- 3. Unless agreed between the partners, neither partner shall be obliged to admit any student where the other partner is unable to provide a reciprocal exchange student in that academic year or semester (as applicable).

- 2. UK LONDON029 aims to send its decision within 4 weeks of receiving all application materials.
- 3. CZ BRNO01 aims to send its decision with 4 weeks of receiving all application materials.

- 4. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 4 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. (UCL endeavours to meet this target, however it may not always be possible). See www.ucl.ac.uk/current-students/exams and awards/qualifications/transcripts. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 5. Termination of the agreement: this agreement will remain in effect for the above determined period of validity or until the involved institutions both agree in the discontinuation of the exchanges. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. NB: Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
